

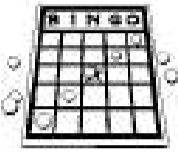

Super Bingo



The City of Yellowknife is accepting applications for a Super Bingo to be held on June 21, 2003.

A super bingo is any bingo with a prize pay out over \$50,000 and not more than \$100,000. The licence will be issued by the City Administrator, or his designate, by way of an open public ballot draw to be held on March 14th at 3:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chamber.

Application forms are not required. Applicants must provide a brief letter including the proposed use of proceeds, demonstrating that there is sufficient community benefit. All terms and conditions of the Lottery Licensing By-law will apply.

Applications must be received by the City Treasurer not later than 3:00 p.m. March 12, 2003.

The City of Yellowknife has given First Reading to By-law No. 4249, a by-law amending City of Yellowknife Zoning By-law No. 4024. The intent of By-law No. 4249 is to rezone Lot 3, Block 551, Plan 2888 from "PR" - Parks and Recreation to "R5" - Residential - Manufactured Housing. Lot 3, Block 551 is a 17.4 acre undeveloped parcel located at the corner of Kam Lake Road and Finlayson Drive.

Employment Opportunity Fire Fighter - Probationer



The City of Yellowknife is currently seeking an individual with fire fighting/emergency medical experience to assume the position of Fire Fighter-Probationer.

Duties include: firefighting, emergency medical attendant, rescue, maintenance of the division's buildings and equipment, and participating in life safety/public education programs. The successful candidate will participate in training sessions regarding various aspects of the Fire Division and be expected to maintain acceptable attendance to the emergency call-out system.

The applicant will possess an International Fire Fighter Certification in accordance with National Fire Protection Association standards: 1001 Level II (Fire Fighter), and 1002 (Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator), an EMT-A certificate from an accredited Canadian Medical Association training institution, and current Basic Trauma Life Support and CPR Level "C" certification. The candidate must hold a Class III Driver's Licence with airbrake endorsement.

Applicants will be required to undergo written, practical, physical competency examinations, and a medical certifying their ability to perform the duties associated with a firefighter.

SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION

Snow Removal Schedule

The snow removal season runs from the beginning of January to the end of March and is dependent on the weather. Residents are informed of snow being removed from City streets by radio ads and signs that are placed the day before. Snow removal begins at 1:00 a.m. and takes place during the early morning to avoid conflicts with motorists, pedestrians, and children at play. The schedule for the week of February 17 to 21, 2003 is:

Monday, February 17, 2003

Morrison Drive from Ndilo Hill to McMeekan Causeway, and 46 Street from 49th Avenue to 50th Avenue

Tuesday, February 18, 2003

McDonald Drive, and Matonabee Street from Franklin Avenue to end.

Wednesday, February 19, 2003

Ndilo Hill, and Gitzel Street from Franklin Avenue to Matonabee Street.

Thursday, February 20, 2003

Wiley Road from McMeekan Causeway to Franklin Avenue; School Draw from Franklin Avenue to Lundquist Road, and 45 Street from Franklin Avenue to 40 Avenue.

Friday, February 21, 2003

Hearne Hill Road from McMeekan Causeway to Otto Drive; and Con Road from 54 Street to end.

The schedule may change depending on weather conditions - please listen to upcoming radio ads and watch for snow removal signs on your street.
