Attention Recyclers!

The City is still experiencing problems with unacceptable items being placed in the Newsprint recycling bins around town. Most recently, a large amount of shredded bond paper was placed in one of our newsprint bins instead of being taken to the landfill and recycled with office/computer paper.

Please be aware that placing any unacceptable items in the bin can make the entire load unusable. **Cardboard, bond paper, brown paper products, plastics and metals** are all items that should **NOT** be deposited in the newsprint bins. Acceptable items are newsprint (newspapers and flyers), pamphlets (including glossy ones!), magazines and catalogues.
