PUBLIC NOTICE

By-law No. 4299

The City of Yellowknife has given First Reading to By-law No. 4299, a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 4024. The purpose of By-law No. 4299 is to amend the "LI" - Limited Industrial zoning designation which applies to the new industrial subdivision being developed at Lot 11, Block 553 (adjacent to Deh Cho Boulevard). The proposed amendment will add accessory dwelling units as a permitted use, and add provisions required for the development of an accessory dwelling unit in the "LI" - Limited Industrial zone.

The Council of the City of Yellowknife will hold a PUBLIC HEARING at seven o'clock in the evening (7:00 P.M.) on Monday, February 23, 2004 in the City Hall Council Chamber to hear any representations to By-law No. 4299.

SNOW REMOVAL SCHEDULE

Week of February 9 to 13, 2004

The snow removal season runs from the beginning of January to the end of March and is dependent on the weather. Residents are informed of snow being removed from City streets by radio ads and signs that are placed the day before removal. Snow removal begins at 1:00 a.m. and takes place during the early morning to avoid conflicts with motorists, pedestrians and children at play.

Monday, February 9, 2004

- Franklin Avenue, from 44 Street to 47 Street;
- 45 Street, from 49 Avenue to Franklin Avenue; and
- 49 Street, from 49 Avenue to the Visitors Centre.

Tuesday, February 10, 2004

- McDonald Drive, from Weaver Road to the Causeway; and
- 44 Street, from 49 Avenue to Franklin Avenue.

Wednesday, February 11, 2004

- Wiley Road, from the Causeway to Franklin Avenue; and
- Borden Drive, from Old Airport Road to Ward Crescent.

Thursday, February 12, 2004

- 46 Street, from 52 Avenue to the end; and
- Borden Drive, from Ward Crescent to Rivett Crescent.

Friday, February 13, 2004

- 56 Street, from 51A Avenue to 52 Avenue; and
- Borden Drive, from Rivett Crescent to Herriman Road.

The schedule may change depending on weather conditions - please listen to upcoming radio ads and watch for snow removal signs on your street.

Snow Removal Operations

The City of Yellowknife is currently in the process of removing snow from roads and sidewalks in the City. Snow removal is generally performed once in the residential areas of the City, and twice in the downtown core. Snow removal operations involve a grader removing snow from roads and sidewalks. This may cause a drop off at residents' driveways. The height of the drop off will vary depending on the snow accumulation, but could be in the 100-300 mm range (4-12 inches). Residents should plan on ramping their driveway to the City street after snow removal, as this is not performed by the City. As well, motorists should keep to the right of snow piles that are placed in the center of streets during snow removal.

The City appreciates your patience as we work towards the safe removal of snow from City streets.
