## FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

### Special Grants

The City of Yellowknife is now accepting funding applications for 2004 projects, events and/or programs for non-profit organizations. Applications **must** be submitted to the Community Services Department by **5:00 p.m., Monday, January 12, 2004.**

#### Criteria:

- Each organization shall be a non-profit organization or a not-for-profit organization registered under the *Societies Act* of the Northwest Territories or registered under the *Income Tax Act* as a federal charity.
- Each organization must demonstrate a need for the funds requested.
- Each project, event or organization must clearly benefit the community, and the activity to be funded must be municipal in nature.
- Matching funds from other sources may be required.
- Under normal circumstances, only one request per organization will be considered in a calendar year.
- The City of Yellowknife will contribute funding to organizations for new programs or the enhancement of existing programs. Funding will not be provided for ongoing operational and maintenance costs, with the exception of those organizations identified for core funding by Council via the budget process.
- The City may consider applications for one-time only contributions to assist in the development of new organizations.
- Organizations must demonstrate other active fund-raising efforts.
- Organizations applying for funds to offset the reduction of funding levels by the Government of the Northwest Territories will not be eligible for funding from the City.
