



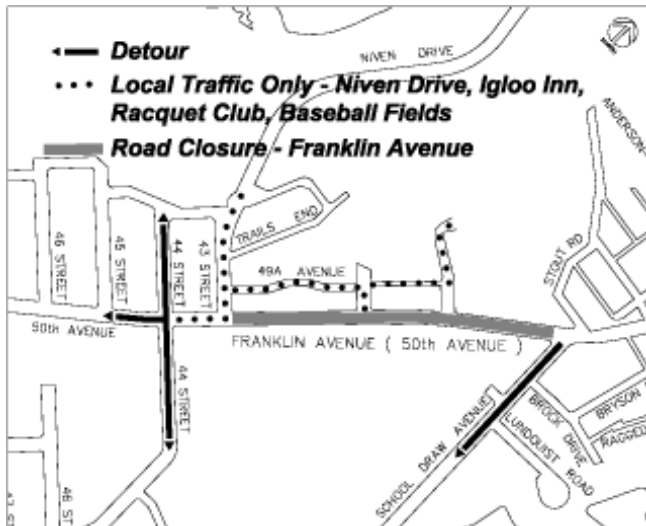

The public is hereby advised that a hearing of the Development Appeal Board of the City of Yellowknife has been scheduled for **Wednesday, June 16, 2004 at 7:00 p.m.** The hearing will be in the lower boardroom at City Hall.

The purpose of the hearing is to consider an Appeal of the decision of the City Development Officer to issue a Development Permit for modification of contours and natural features to facilitate the installation of linear infrastructure and positive site drainage in accordance with the approved plan of subdivision for the Niven Lake Phase 6 residential development (Lots 1091 & 1092, Quad 85J8 and Road).
