Systems Analyst Information Technology Division

The City of Yellowknife is currently seeking an individual to assume the position of Systems Analyst, Information Technology. Under the general direction of the Manager, Information Technology, the incumbent provides support for the City's information technology infrastructure. Primary areas of responsibility include managing the City's databases, user services and project support services. The incumbent will also contribute to planning and assessing user requirements, and assisting in acquisition, implementation, testing, configuration and deployment of software applications.

Project support service responsibilities include database management, writing and maintaining documentation and procedures, installing and configuring software, and recommending and implementing policies. User service responsibilities include serving as a liaison with user groups, troubleshooting and resolving hardware and software problems, and providing network support assistance.

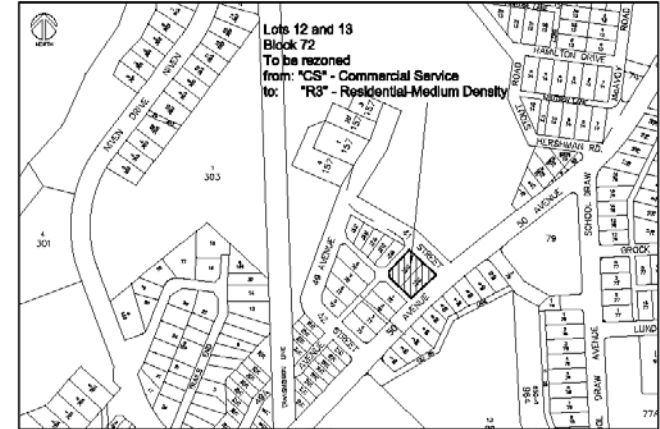

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS (2)

By-law No. 4313

The City of Yellowknife has given First Reading to By-law No. 4313, a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 4024. The purpose of By-law No. 4313 is to rezone Lots 12 and 13, Block 72 from "CS" – Commercial Service to "R3" – Residential – Medium Density.



By-law No. 4314

The City of Yellowknife has also given First Reading to By-law No. 4314, a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 4024. The purpose of By-law No. 4314 is to add office uses as a Permitted Use specific to Lot 3, Block 68A (4504 – 49 Avenue, Denendeh Manor). The property is currently zoned "R3" – Residential – Medium Density which does not permit office uses. The office use of Denendeh Manor would be restricted to a maximum of 50% of the floor area of the building.

The Council of the City of Yellowknife will hold PUBLIC HEARINGS at seven o'clock in the evening (7:00 P.M.) on Tuesday, May 25, 2004 in the City Hall Council Chamber to hear any representations to By-law No. 4313 or By-law No. 4314.

ANIMAL WASTE

Deposit at Fiddler's Lagoon

Spring is coming and thoughts are turning to yard clean-up and what to do with the waste your pets have deposited over the winter.

The City wishes to remind pet owners not to put any animal waste in your regular garbage. It is unhealthy and unpleasant for the garbage men, and it is unacceptable to be compacted in the City's baler. Our collection contractor is not required to pick up any such waste.

Instead, all animal waste should be taken to **Fiddler's Lagoon** (located 5km past the airport on Highway #3) for deposit into the honeybag pit.
