SOLID WASTE LANDFILL

Summer Hours

The City's solid waste landfill site summer hours commence Monday, May 3, 2004.

Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Deposit at Fiddler's Lagoon

Spring is coming and thoughts are turning to yard clean-up and what to do with the waste your pets have deposited over the winter.

Please do not put any animal waste in your regular garbage. It is unhealthy and unpleasant for the garbage men, and it is unacceptable to be compacted in the City's baler. Our collection contractor is not required to pick up any such waste.

Instead, all animal waste should be taken to **Fiddler's Lagoon** (located 5km past the airport on Highway #3) for deposit into the honeybag pit.
