PUBLIC NOTICE

By-law No. 4299

The City of Yellowknife has given First Reading to By-law No. 4299, a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 4024. The purpose of By-law No. 4299 is to amend the "LI" - Limited Industrial zoning designation which applies to the new industrial subdivision being developed at Lot 11, Block 553 (adjacent to Deh Cho Boulevard). The proposed amendment will add accessory dwelling units as a permitted use, and add provisions required for the development of an accessory dwelling unit in the "LI" - Limited Industrial zone.

The Council of the City of Yellowknife will hold a PUBLIC HEARING at seven o'clock in the evening (7:00 P.M.) on Monday, February 23, 2004 in the City Hall Council Chamber to hear any representations to By-law No. 4299.

HURRY! Heritage Art Show

The City of Yellowknife Heritage Committee will sponsor an Art Show during the annual Heritage Week celebrations in February 2004. Artists are invited to make submissions of original art works or photos relating to the heritage and history of Yellowknife. Artist's submissions must include a biography and contact information with an accompanying photograph or conceptual description of the artwork proposed for display. Art must be framed and ready for hanging or display, and will be on public display at the museum for at least one month.

Submissions will be accepted at the City of Yellowknife not later than February 2, 2004. Selection of the works chosen for display will be made by the Heritage Committee.

WATER & SEWER SERVICES

Is Your Freeze Protection On?

Heat Tape, Aquaflows and Circulating Pumps all help to protect water services from freezing. A number of freeze-ups have occurred already this winter due to freeze protections not being on. This may cause damage to the service and may require the service to be repaired or replaced - a replacement can cost upwards of \$10,000.

It's the responsibility of the homeowner to make sure their freeze protection is working. Replacement due to negligence will not be covered under the Service Connection Failure Assistance Program.

Homeowners should check to make sure that one or more of the following is working: Heat Tape - is it on?; Aquaflow - is it working?; or Circulating Pump - is it on?

In the case of power outages, it may be prudent to turn a tap on (slow trickle) and flush your toilets periodically to allow water to flow, and prevent the service from freezing.

SNOW REMOVAL SCHEDULE

Week of February 2 to 6, 2004

The snow removal season runs from the beginning of January to the end of March and is dependent on the weather. Residents are informed of snow being removed from City streets by radio ads and signs that are placed the day before removal. YOUTH SNOWMOBILERS

Snowmobile Safety Course

Parents, do you have a youth at home that is 12 years of age or older and wants to ride with you in the City? They can ride off road only with the supervision of an adult and if they have completed a snowmobile safety course. RECREATIONAL SAFETY

Tobogganing & Sledding

- Go down the hill sitting up or kneeling on the sled, never go down head first or standing up.
- Be sure the way is clear right down to the bottom; do not go down right after another person.
- Children under 12 should be supervised by an adult.
- Children under 5 should have a responsible adult on the toboggan with them.
