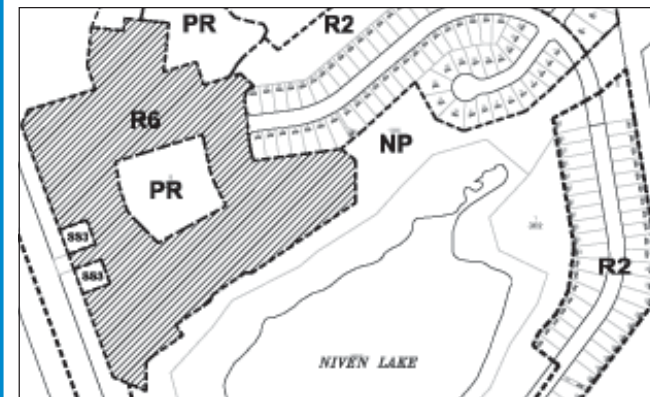

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

By-law Nos. 4362 and 4363

The City of Yellowknife has given First Reading to By-law Nos. 4362 and 4363, by-laws to amend Niven Lake Development Scheme 2004 By-law No. 4339 and Zoning By-law No. 4024 respectively. The purpose of By-law Nos. 4362 and 4363 is to create a new "R6" – Residential – Limited Manufactured Dwelling zone that will apply to the Phase 6 area of the Niven Lake residential subdivision. The proposed "R6" zone would allow for the siting of manufactured double wide dwellings, and subject development in the Phase 6 area of Niven Lake to residential design standards intended to limit the use of similarly designed dwellings. The map below indicates the area to which the "R6" – Residential – Limited Manufactured Dwelling zone would apply.

CAPITAL PROJECTS**2005 Water & Sewer and Paving**

The City of Yellowknife wishes to inform residents that initial construction work on the 2005 Water & Sewer and Paving capital projects has commenced.

The City has three major Water & Sewer projects to be completed this summer. The first consists of the lakeside section of **School Draw Avenue** adjacent to the Dettah ice road access. The second project consists of water and sewer replacement on the first half of **Gitzel Street** from Franklin Avenue to Dakota Court. The third project involves water and sewer work on a central section of **Hordal Road**, which entails the regrading of the sanitary sewer.

The City will also be completing a number of paving projects this summer. New paving will occur on **Enterprise Drive** in Kam Lake, on **Range Lake Road** from Hordal to Bourque, and in the **Forrest Drive Trailer Park**. Paving will also occur on **Rycon Drive**, **Woolgar Avenue**, **Bigelow Crescent**, **Williams Avenue** and **Dusseault Court** to cover areas where water and sewer reconstruction occurred in 2003 and 2004. Road reconstruction is scheduled to commence on **Range Lake Road** (the access road to the new Extra Foods), and on **Old Airport Road** from the Co-op to Borden Drive.

Neighborhood meetings are planned for certain areas. Residents will be notified by door cards and the weekly flyer. Project details will be explained at these meetings, and any resident concerns related to the work will be addressed.
