GARBAGE COLLECTION**Grass Clippings**

On June 14, 2004, City Council passed a motion restricting the collection of yard waste, such as grass clippings, by the City's garbage contractor, as these materials can cause mechanical problems to both the garbage trucks and the baler at the City Baling Facility. Yard waste consisting of grass and leaves gets caught in the garbage truck compactors and gets tangled in the baler leading to mechanical slowdowns. In addition, if dog excrement is put in with the yard waste (as does occur), besides being unsanitary and unpleasant for the garbage truck drivers and baling facility staff who handle the waste, it further compounds the mechanical slowdown of equipment.

As such, residents should note that yard waste and dog excrement left at the curb for garbage pickup will not be collected. Yard waste, such as grass clippings, can be composted by homeowners or taken to the Baling Facility to be placed in a designated area for composting. Dog excrement is to be taken to the Fiddler's Lake Lagoon.
