Building Inspector II

The incumbent examines and recommends for approval or rejection, plans and specifications submitted in compliance with statutory provisions, standards, procedures and by-laws. Inspects work in progress and completed work to ensure that it has been performed according to statutory provisions, standards, procedures and by-laws. Assists the Manager on knowledge and standards regarding statutory provisions, regulations on by-laws and interprets same to the general public and to City Administration. Carries out mathematical calculations pertinent to the examination and recommendation for approval and for enforcement of statutory provisions, standards, procedures and by-laws.

The work requires knowledge in the principles and methods of construction and the regulations and by-laws to be enforced. Applicants should have a solid knowledge of the Building Code. There is also a need to be able to read detailed building plans. This knowledge is normally acquired through completion of a building technology course or completion of Grade 12 and certification from a mechanical program, plus three to five years experience in inspections work. Hauling Garbage

The City would like to remind residents that the Solid Waste Management By-law No. 4376 requires a person transporting garbage to the landfill site to either have the load enclosed in the vehicle or secured by a cover, such as a tarpaulin, a mesh blanket or plywood board capable of securing the load. Persons not properly securing loads to the landfill site could face a fine of \$150.00 or have to pay double the tipping fees.

The City thanks you for your cooperation in helping to keep Yellowknife clean and litter free.

DID YOU KNOW...?

The Difference between Boxboard and Corrugated Cardboard

Boxboard recycling bins are here!!! These new blue bins accept office paper and box board. Box board is a rigid, multi layered paper board like cereal or tissue boxes. Do not include boxboard products from the refrigerator or freezer which are coated with a waxy surface as a moisture barrier. Please read the instruction posted on recycling bin and deposit your recyclables in the appropriate bin.

Corrugated cardboard is made with three layers of brown paper glued together. The centre layer is fluted or wavy and gives the corrugated cardboard strength.

LANDFILL HOURS

Monday, August 7, 2006 is a civic holiday, the landfill hours will be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. to allow better public access. The restricted hours will shift forward one day, and on Tuesday, August 8, the landfill will be open to the public only from 3:45 to 5:45 p.m. The recycling bins and household waste compactor are open to the public during restricted hours.
