DID YOU KNOW...?

It is an offence to leave a vehicle or trailer on a City street for longer than 72 hours without moving it. People who work out of town for extended periods of time should make arrangements to store their vehicle off street. Any vehicle or trailer parked on a City street must have current registration and must have the licence plate attached.

DID YOU KNOW...?

It is an offence under the Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063 to shovel the snow from your property onto the street. The only snow which is permitted to be put onto the street is snow which is removed from the sidewalk and this snow must not be piled in a manner as to obstruct traffic.
