**SPRING RUN OFF**

**Water Pooling on Private Property**

Snow melt and spring run off are upon us. Drainage water can accumulate in basements, under trailers, pond in backyards or flow onto adjacent properties (if proper drainage is not in place) and needs to be dealt with to minimize property damage or inconvenience. The City is often asked to pump puddles or remedy existing situations that it does not have the resources to address. We ask that, before you call the City, please try to work out the drainage issues with your neighbours, it may mean setting up a pump or digging a channel with a shovel, for a short term solution, then use the following drier season to come to a longer term, permanent solution. We had above average snow fall this winter and the runoff will subside in a few short weeks, enjoy the spring, it's a great time of the year to be in Yellowknife!

**ANIMAL WASTE**

**Deposit at Fiddler's Lagoon**

Spring is coming and thoughts are turning to yard clean-up and what to do with the waste your pets have deposited over the winter.

Please do not put any animal waste in your regular garbage. It is unhealthy and unpleasant for the garbage men, and it is unacceptable to be compacted in the City's baler. Our collection contractor is not required to pick up any such waste, and garbage men will leave the animal waste behind. Instead, all animal waste should be taken to **Fiddler's Lagoon** (located 5km past the airport on Highway #3) for deposit into the honeybag pit.
