SECURED FUNDING

Con Mine District Geothermal System Feasibility Study

The City of Yellowknife has secured \$296,000 to conduct a feasibility study to determine if heat in Con Mine can be drawn to the surface and utilized in the community. Funding for the project will be provided by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities – Green Municipal Fund (\$142,500), The Department of Indian and Northern Affairs - Target Investment Program (\$100,000) and The Department of Environment and Natural Resources GNWT – Energy Conservation Program (\$25,000). The City will also contribute \$28,500 to the project from the Community Energy Planning Budget.

The objectives of the study will be to determine if energy can be harvested economically from the mine for the purpose of heating within the community. To determine this the feasibility study will attempt to:

- determine how much energy is in the mine;
- establish how the energy would be used in the community;
- develop a business case for a specific development; and
- confirm temperatures and water content by drilling into the mine.

The City expects to have a research team in place to begin the study in early 2008. A preliminary report outlining the concept of utilizing the heat in Con Mine was prepared by the University of British Columbia's Mining Engineering Department and can be viewed on the city website at www.yellowknife.ca.
