Public Bus Shelters Vandalized

City of Yellowknife bus shelters have been the recent target of vandalism. The City's Public Works crews have reported the breakage of 16 panes of glass in bus shelters in one week. The costs associated with this type of vandalism continue to rise, costing citizens thousands of tax dollars every year. Each pane of glass costs the City \$500 plus installation.

Supervisory Constable Daryle Foster, of the Municipal Enforcement Division, advises that vandalism is a criminal offence and that the vandals can also be charged under the Public Transit By-law. Foster notes that a charge under the Public Transit By-law for damaging a bus shelter carries a penalty of \$1,000.

Public Works crews have completed the repairs, however, Greg Kehoe, Director of Public Works and Engineering notes that "Having to effect these types of repairs detracts crews from their regular important duties."
