

**CITY OF YELLOWKNIFE  
BY-LAW NO. 4478**

A BY-LAW of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories, to amend Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063, as amended to date.

PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 70 and 73 of the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act*, S.N.W.T. 2003, c.22;

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife has enacted Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063; and

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife wishes to amend Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063 Section 2 and Section 66 which relates to definitions and idling vehicles;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife wishes to add a severability clause to Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF YELLOWKNIFE, in regular session duly assembled, enacts as follows:

**APPLICATION**

1. That Highway Traffic By-law No. 4063 is hereby amended by:

(a) Adding the definition of "Idle" to Section 2 with:

"Idle"	means the operation of a vehicle engine while the vehicle is not in motion and "idling" has a corresponding meaning.
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(b) Deleting the definition of a "Mobile Workshop" from Section 2 in its entirety and replacing it with:

"Mobile Workshop" means a vehicle containing equipment that must be operated inside or in association with the vehicle or a vehicle serving as a facility for taking measurements, or making observations or conducting maintenance or construction operated by or on behalf of the City, public utility or enforcement, fire or emergency service.

- (c) Adding the definition of "Vehicle - Power Take Off" to Section 2 with:

"Vehicle-Power Take Off" means a vehicle containing work equipment that must be powered by the vehicle engine.

- (d) Deleting Section 66 in its entirety and replacing it with:

66. (1) No person shall cause or permit an unattended vehicle engine to idle for more than 3 minutes in a 60 minute period.

- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to the following:

- (a) Police, enforcement, fire or ambulance vehicles while engaged in operational activities;
- (b) Vehicles assisting in an emergency activity;
- (c) A mobile workshop while such vehicle is being used as a mobile workshop;
- (d) Vehicles with power take-off while they are in the course of being used for their basic function;
- (e) Vehicles for which idling is required to service the engine or conduct repairs;

- (f) Armoured vehicles which a person remains inside the vehicle while guarding the contents, or while the vehicle is being loaded or unloaded;
- (g) Vehicles remaining motionless because of an emergency, traffic, weather conditions or mechanical difficulties over which the driver has no control;
- (h) Vehicles engaged in the course of a parade, procession or race or any other event authorized by Council;
- (i) Vehicles idling while passengers are embarking or disembarking;
- (j) Vehicles when the ambient temperature outside is less than -10 degrees Celsius, and then for no longer than 15 minutes.

- (3) An unattended vehicle which is left idling with the keys in the ignition must have all the doors locked.

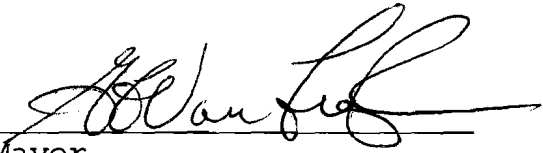
- (e) Amending Schedule D to separate the fines for Section 65 and 66 to read as follows:

Large vehicle illegally idling	65	\$40.00
Vehicle illegally idling	66(1)	\$40.00
Unattended Vehicle idling with keys in ignition and doors unlocked	66(3)	\$40.00

#### **EFFECT**


- 2. This by-law shall come into effect upon having received Third Reading and otherwise meeting the requirements of Section 75 of the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act*.

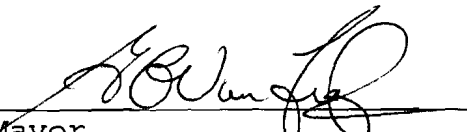
