ENUMERATION UNDERWAY FOR 2022 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

The City of Yellowknife has begun preparations for the 2022 Municipal General Election which will take place on **October 17, 2022**. Enumeration cards have now been mailed to all Yellowknife households. Enumeration is the process of collecting names of eligible voters for the Voters List. The City of Yellowknife is also enumerating voters on behalf of Yellowknife Education District No. 1 (Public) and Yellowknife Catholic Schools (Separate).

The election is being conducted via Vote by Mail. Residents must complete their enumeration by **September 22, 2022** to ensure that a Vote by Mail ballot kit is automatically mailed to their residence. If that information is not accurate, or residents are not on the Voters List, they will not get a ballot kit but may vote in person at a Voter Assistance Location on **October 17, 2022**.

Why is the City going to a mail-in ballot election for this election?

The City successfully used mail-in ballots for the 2021 referendum on borrowing for the Aquatic Centre. After considering all options, City Administration made the decision to proceed with Mail-in ballots for the 2022 Municipal Election because it is:

- Safe – the risk of community spread if there is a COVID outbreak this Fall is greatly reduced by giving voters the option of mailing their ballots in.
- Accessible – ballots come to voters' mailboxes and can be dropped off in the mail or at City Hall making it easy for voters with mobility issues.
- Cost effective – the cost of mail-out ballots comes in slightly less than costs for a 'regular' election given the City is not hiring 75 election staff or operating 7 voting stations.
- Convenient – voters have options on where and when they vote.
- Flexible – voters can vote by mail in advance OR choose to go to one of the Voter Assistance Centres on Election Day to cast their vote.
- Administratively effective - fewer staff are needed; hiring election staff has been a challenge over the past 2 elections (not including the referendum).

Residents are eligible to vote if they:

- Are a Canadian citizen;
- Have attained 18 years of age; and
- Have resided in Yellowknife for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the day on which they vote (**October 17, 2021**).

ENUMERATION UNDERWAY FOR 2022 MUNICIPAL ELECTION (CONTINUED)

Residents who are eligible to vote and:

- Have moved to Yellowknife since the last municipal election in 2018;
- Have moved homes within Yellowknife since the last municipal election in 2018;
- Are unsure of their school board declaration; or
- Who want to register to vote;

Are being asked to enumerate their household by one of the following methods:

- Online at www.yellowknife.ca/elections;
- Completing and returning the enumeration card to the City of Yellowknife;
- Calling 920-5602.

Voters must clearly identify their School Board preference at the time of enumeration to be eligible to vote for the board of their choice on Election Day. Where a resident supports both school boards, the *Education Act* states the resident may vote for either school board, but may not vote for both.

Students returning to school outside of Yellowknife in the fall should put their place of residence as of October 2022 when enumerating, or appoint a proxy to cast their vote.

CITY WIDE FIRE BAN LIFTED

Effective immediately, the mandatory ban on open-air fires that has been in place since Monday, July 4, 2022, has been lifted for the City of Yellowknife. Burning is permitted in approved fire pits only. Burning in an unapproved pit will result in a fine. The City of Yellowknife Fire Division may issue a Fire Ban, due to changes and increased risk due to weather and environmental conditions. The City of Yellowknife Fire Division will continue to monitor conditions and notify the public of any status changes as they occur.

BUSINESS LICENCE FEE WAIVER PROGRAM

The City of Yellowknife is taking action to help local businesses and our economy recover from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. For 12 months, beginning September 1, 2021, the City will waive business licence fees for eligible small and medium-sized businesses when renewing their licence. Any business applying to the program must meet all eligibility criteria.

Eligibility requirements:

1. Business must have twenty (20) employees or less.
2. Business must be located within the City of Yellowknife, have a valid business licence, and operate in accordance with applicable By-laws and permits.
3. Eligible businesses must operate in one of the following qualifying industries:
 - Food and Retail services;
 - Hospitality and Tourism;
 - Arts, Culture and Entertainment;
 - Home-based businesses;
 - Personal care services (including registered medical practitioners); and,
 - Recreation.
4. Franchises must be independently owned and operated.
5. Business must have been open/operating between March 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.
6. Businesses must be open/operating as of the date of the application for the waiver of business licence fees.
7. Businesses must be in good financial standing with the City (municipal taxes, fees and charges, etc.)

If requested, eligible businesses must be able to demonstrate a revenue loss of at least 20% between **March 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021.**
