

The City of Yellowknife Day Camp Covid-19 Plan

The City of Yellowknife is planning to offer their annual Summer Day Camps to be offered from June 29

The Camps will be divided into 4 separate camps at the following facilities:

Day Camp for 5 -6 years			
Location:	Multiplex, Gym	1 staff to 8 children	Max enrollment 16 Children
Day Camp for 7 to 8 years			
Location:	Multiplex, Shorty Brown Arena	1 staff to 10 children	max enrollment 20 children
Day Camp for 9 to 12 years			
Location:	Fieldhouse, Sports Field	1 staff to 10 children	max enrollment 20 children
Multisport Camp 8 to 12 years			
Location:	McNiven Beach Tennis Courts	1 staff to 10 children	max enrollment 20 children

ADDITIONAL MEASURES TAKEN FOR COVID-19:

Drop-off/Pick-up and Health Protocols:

- When dropping off or picking up your child, please refrain from entering the building. Each age group
 will have a separate entrance and a camp leader will be available to sign in and out your
 child/children at the door. This will reduce cross contamination between families and program staff.
- Appropriate Signage will be posted to notify parents of the specific drop off/ pick up locations
- We ask that the parents to call ahead when picking up their child so we can have them dressed and ready for pick up. This will reduce cross contamination between families and program staff.
- Parents should remember to practice social distancing while dropping child off and respect the
 directions that will be provided. Staggered drop-off times by sign-up may be considered to streamline
 the process and you will hear more about this from the Day Camp Coordinator.
- Parents will be asked a series of questions at drop-off time, regarding your child's health and families continued health, and the child's temperature will be checked prior to entrance into the camp
- If your child shows any signs of illness, they will not be permitted to participate in day camp. If they show signs of illness throughout the day, they will be relocated in a safe area along with a staff member who will contact parent/guardian to pick up the child as soon as possible.
- Campers will be expected to use hand sanitizer upon entering. They will then store their personal belongings in their designated area, wear appropriate footwear and wash hands with soap and water before continuing with their day. Each camp will have a dedicated washroom.

At Camp:

- The following activities will not occur at camp this year: Swimming, Climbing Wall, and Gymnastics.
- Children will be given a designated storage area, marked off with tape and their name to store their personal belongings. This will reduce cross contamination between fellow campers and program staff.
- Staff will be provided with all required PPE, and this will also be available to campers on request.



- Hand Sanitizer and Handwashing stations will always be available throughout all locations and carried by staff on field excursions to playground and after games.
- Each camp will not be permitted to intermingle.
- Safe distancing will be encouraged by staff to campers throughout the day.
- Appropriate signage/ messaging will be hung throughout the facility again to promote washing of hands, safe distancing, not to put items in their mouth and or share personal items.
- Parents are encouraged to have their children bring their own water bottles with their name clearly
 written on the bottle. Water Fountains will only be used to fill water personal water bottles; direct
 drinking will not be permitted to prevent cross contamination. (Disposable cups will be made
 available if child happens to forget their water bottle)
- Snack time and Lunches will be located in a specific area of the facility.
 - o Tables will be spaced so that children are 2 meters apart.
 - Children will not be permitted to share food. T
 - he Eating areas will be cleaned immediately after snack and lunch time by approved disinfectant cleaners.

Camp Equipment:

- Each camp will have its own supply of toys, games etc. available to play with
 - These toys/ games will be disinfected after each play. In addition, children will be using hand sanitizer and will be washing hands often, throughout the day.
- Each child will have their own Ziploc bag of art supplies such as markers and scissors. These are to remain at camp and in their storage square. These items will be disinfected at the end of each week and used again the following week.

Staff Protection:

- Staff will wear carry on them at all times appropriate PPE to use in the following scenarios
 - Deal with a child's injury. Cleaning of cuts and scrapes (First aid)
 - Care for a child that may need some TLC
 - When Separating a dispute
- PPE
- Face Masks
- o Gloves
- Face Shields
- Bottles of Hand sanitizer cared on them throughout the day
- WSCC Staff Risk Assignment conducted during staff training
- WHMIS Training
