Why Try Tearing Paper Crafts?

Tearing paper is a great crafting idea to try with kids as it can help promote their fine motor skills activity. The OT Toolbox is written by Colleen who is a trained Occupational Therapist and she has a great article about <u>torn paper art</u> which explains all the benefits of it as well as why fine motor skills are so important for kids.



Materials Needed for This Craft:

Printed copy of our Earth template

Blue Paper

Green Paper

Glue

Torn Paper Earth Craft

To make this craft the first thing you'll need is a copy of our <u>printable Earth template</u>, it's free for personal or school / preschool use so go and grab as many copies as you'd like, we've also got some more ideas there of how you could use it.

The next thing to do is cover your Earth with glue. I did a quick experiment with this and PVA / school glue held the paper a lot better than the traditional glue stick style ones. Next tear up your paper, if you don't have any green or blue paper you could do this instead as a paper collage earth looking for those colours in old comics or magazines.

Tear the paper up and then stick the green pieces onto the land areas and the blue pieces onto the sea. Older children will obviously be a bit more accurate with this than younger ones but the most important thing here is to have fun!

This simple **cupcake liner flowers** craft is great for preschoolers and kindergartners to make. All they need are a few craft supplies and they can make it on their own. These flowers would be perfect as gifts or decorations for around the house.



One of our favorite craft supplies is cupcake liners because they come in so many colors, designs, and sizes. The nice thing is their circular shape lends itself to a lot of crafts, and they save you from having to spend hours cutting out circles. The pleated sides of the cupcake liners also add nice texture to any craft like today's cupcake liner flowers craft – such lovely petals!

Supplies:

- 3 Cupcake liners
- 3 Craft sticks or a 3 strips of green construction paper
- Green paint
- Paint brush
- Glue
- Green paper
- Blue paper
- Scissors
- Pencil or pen



How to make cupcake liner flowers with kids

If you are making a card, fold the blue paper in half and then follow along with the rest of the directions.

Start by having your child draw 6 leaves on the green paper. Once they are done have them cut them out.

Next have them paint their craft sticks green or use already painted craft sticks for a quick and easy shortcut.



Have the child glue their leaves and cupcake liners to the craft stick and the craft is done. So easy! Now you can enjoy beautiful spring flowers while spending time inside with your favorite little crafter!
