# **HOW TO PREPARE**

CARDBOARD



- Corrugated cardboard has wavy lines in between layers
- TV and refrigerator boxes
- Packing and filing boxes
- Pizza boxes ► to compost
- Waxed (shiny) cardboard
- Boxboard

**MIXED PAPER** 



- Boxboard (cracker, cereal boxes)
- Coloured, glossy, brown paper
- Magazines, wrapping paper
- Paper egg cartons, envelopes
- Pizza boxes, newspaper
- Waxed (shiny) cardboard
- Paper towels & tissues
- Styrofoam, plastic egg cartons
- Make sure paper is clean and dry
- Staples and paperclips can be left in

WHITE **PAPER** 



- Unglossed white paper
- Looseleaf
- Receipts
- Envelopes
- Other mixed paper
- Make sure paper is clean and dry
- Ink, staples & paperclips can be left in

**NEWSPAPER** 



Newsprint

- Glossy inserts and flyers
- Mixed or white paper
- Phone books
- ► All to mixed paper

Make sure paper is clean and dry

**GLASS** 



Glass jars and containers

- Lightbulbs
- Mirrors
- Ceramics and clay
- Windows
- Empty and rinse
- · Remove lids and put with tin cans
- Labels can be left on

TIN CANS



- Tin food cans
- Tinfoil
- Tin jar lids
- Aerosol cans
- Propane bottles
- Paint cans
- Aluminum cans (pop, beer)
- Empty and rinse
- Remove lids and trap them inside cans
- Labels can be left on

# **PLASTICS**

Check the hottom of the container to find this symbol. The number



in the middle tells you what type of plastic it is.







- Yogurt & margarine containers
- Ice cream buckets
- Detergent, window cleaner & shampoo bottles



- Plastic utensils
- Ketchup & syrup bottles
- Empty and rinse
- Remove caps: if 2,3, 5 or 7, they can be recycled; all others go to garbage

## **ELECTRONIC** WASTE





- Cell phones, telephones
- Computers & accessories
- Fax machines, printers
- VCRs, DVD players, CD players
- Rechargeable batteries Toner cartridges
- **TVs**

- Batteries (non-rechargeable, lead)
- Fluorescent lightbulbs
- Smoke detectors


These are all accepted in designated areas at the landfill

Separate e-waste items from regular garbage and take them to the e-waste facility within the landfill.

Dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves, washing machines & dryers also have designated drop-off areas

#### **ORGANICS**

Food scraps and other organics are accepted in the City's **Centralized Composting** Program. Items can be placed in "Compost Only" bins at the landfill.



- Dairy products, eggs, fish
- Cooked meat, raw meat (scraps)
- Bread, pasta, rice, cereal
- Coffee grounds, filters, tea bags
- Pizza boxes
- Food-soiled paper, napkins
- Plastic
- Clothing/textiles
- Dead animals & carcasses
- · Cigarette butts, ashes
- Pet feces & cat litter
- Rubber products

Organic materials can be collected in reusable plastic bins or <u>certified</u> compostable plastic bags, then transferred and emptied into "Compost Only" dumpster bins.

#### **ADD VALUE**


By composting organic matter, we create a valuable resource - compost- which improves soil health and helps gardens and lawns grow.
