

# **FIRE SAFETY & EDUCATION**

#### E.D.I.T.H. - Exit Drills in the Home

Practice makes perfect - NOW is a great time to practice your home escape plan. Teach your children to get out safely:

Discuss your plan as a family, including where to meet; then:

- 1. Sound the smoke alarm;
- Evacuate your home through your primary escape route (front door?) Close the door behind you. "Get Out & Stay Out!" [Practice getting out in under 1 minute; smoke will block your way in less than 3 minutes];
- 3. Go to your meeting place outside (is anyone missing?); and
- 4. Report the fire (9-1-1 or 867-873-2222) from outside your home.

Once this is familiar, block the main exit and have family exit through second way out.

Suggestion: Practice the drill when the kids are in bed. (Studies have shown that 9/10 children stay in bed when the smoke alarm activates). Fire doesn't always happen to someone else.
