Sky lanterns (small hot air balloons) are prohibited in Yellowknife and in the NWT.

Penalties will be applied at a rate of 1.8% on all overdue balances on the first day of each calendar month, until overdue amounts are paid in full. Any overdue utility charges as of **December 31, 2023**, will be transferred to property owners' tax accounts.
