- Forrest Drive from 51A Avenue to Con Road.

- Old Airport Road from Kam Lake Road to Byrne Road;
- Old Airport Road from Byrne Road to Kam Lake Road; and
- Con Road from Forrest Drive to House No. 73.

Residents must ensure parked vehicles are removed from these streets by midnight, or they will be towed. Residents are advised that there will be traffic delays in snow removal areas and if possible, to use an alternate route to avoid delays.

REINSTATING PENALTIES FOR TAXES AND UTILITIES

The City of Yellowknife would like to notify the public that penalties will be reinstated for any taxes and utilities outstanding as of **January 31, 2024**. Penalties will be applied at a rate of 1.8% on all overdue balances on the first day of each calendar month, until overdue amounts are paid in full.

Any overdue utility charges as of **December 31, 2023**, will be transferred to property owners' tax accounts. If you are a new owner or a landlord, you should check all utility accounts associated with your property. Call (867) 920-5600 if you do not have a user name and password to access your account.

Please note that if you have had your overdue utility charges transferred to your tax account, your pre-authorized tax payment plan will be cancelled without further notice.
