FIRE BAN

A City of Yellowknife fire ban is in effect on open air burning fire pits and will remain in effect until further notice.

Due to current conditions the area is experiencing, the Yellowknife Fire Division is implementing a fire ban to reduce the risk of wildland fires within city limits.

The fire ban does not affect Canadian Standards Association (CSA) approved propane fueled pits and barbeques.

CALL FOR ARTISTS TO DESIGN STREET POLE BANNERS

The City of Yellowknife is seeking artists who currently reside in Yellowknife to submit design concepts to be included on street pole banners hanging from poles located along Old Airport Road.

All forms of artwork are being accepted, however the final version of the artwork must be converted to a digital format. The deadline to submit a draft concept is **August 4, 2023**. The goal is to accommodate up to 10 unique designs. Successful applicants will receive \$750 for use of their designs and are expected to complete their individual projects by **August 31, 2023**. Artists may submit more than one design, but that doesn't guarantee all designs submitted will be selected.

In 2016 and 2017, the City commissioned artists to paint transformer boxes located throughout the city. The project was well received by both artists and residents.

Did you know there are 23 million coliform bacteria per gram of dog poop? Pet poop that is left in yards, fields, parks and on sidewalks eventually ends up in Yellowknife rivers and lakes.

Dog waste is high in nitrogen and phosphorus which promotes algae growth in ponds and streams. It also can contain Giardia, Parvo, Tapeworms, Roundworms, Salmonella and Coccidia which can linger in soil for years. Be a responsible dog owner.
