# **FIRE BAN**

A City of Yellowknife fire ban is in effect on open air burning fire pits and will remain in effect until further notice.

Due to current conditions the area is experiencing, the Yellowknife Fire Division implemented a fire ban to reduce the risk of wildland fires within city limits.

The fire ban does not affect Canadian Standards Association (CSA) approved propane fueled pits and barbeques.

# FREE ACCESS TO FIELDHOUSE TRACK AND INDOOR PLAYGROUND AMIDST WILDFIRE SMOKE

In light of the ongoing wildfires and their impact on air quality, the City of Yellowknife is granting free access to the track and the indoor playground at the Fieldhouse when the local Air Quality Health Index is of 7 or greater. The Air Quality Health Index for Yellowknife can be found on the *Government of Canada website*.

Community members will be notified when free access to these facilities is in effect via the City's social media channels. This free access is being provided to encourage safe exercise for those at the greatest risk including children, elderly and at-risk populations and is available to all residents.

Note that due to the current Air Quality Health Index, free access to the Fieldhouse track and indoor playground is now in effect, until air quality improves.

Municipal and Territorial fire departments continue to work hard to protect the communities in the area.
