FIRE BAN

A City of Yellowknife fire ban is in effect until further notice on open air burning fire pits.

Due to current conditions the area is experiencing, the Yellowknife Fire Division implemented a fire ban to reduce the risk of wildland fires within city limits. The fire ban does not affect Canadian Standards Association (CSA)approved propane fueled pits and barbeques.

CITY RELEASES OVERVIEW OF EVACUATION FRAMEWORK

The City of Yellowknife has released an overview of its <u>Evacuation Framework</u> to the public, until such time as the plan is in its final format. The City would like to stress that the release of this document is not an indication of a worsening situation in Yellowknife, rather it is to provide information to residents. Yellowknife is not under threat at this time.

This summary, which outlines the two different kinds of evacuations that could happen in Yellowknife, includes sample evacuation instructions and information on what a wildfire evacuation would look like for the community. Please note every emergency is different and the response depends on a number of factors. This framework highlights these factors, but it cannot be stressed enough that these situations are dynamic, so a step-by-step plan cannot be reasonably made and it would be irresponsible to publish an inaccurate plan, as it will cause confusion for residents when real-time changes occur.

CITY OF YELLOWKNIFE WELCOMES BEHCHOKÒ EVACUES

The City of Yellowknife has welcomed residents of Behchokò who were ordered to evacuate their communities as a result of the wildfires nearing their community and adjacent Highway.

The City is working with several Government of the Northwest Territories departments through the North Slave Emergency Measures Organization (EMO) in responding to the need to provide immediate shelter for evacuees arriving in our community. The Multiplex will be closed to the public until further notice and has been converted to provide immediate shelter for evacuees arriving to Yellowknife. Evacuees are being asked to register with Yellowknife Health and Social Services Authority (YHSSA) at the Multiplex.

If you need additional water delivery or sewage pumpout at your home, please contact the service provider (WB Services or Kavanaugh) and the City will manage the costs of the additional callout. If you have more household garbage than your bin can accommodate, the City will waive the residential tipping fee at the Solid Waste Facility if you are accompanied by an evacuee (wearing a wristband). Please note that other tipping fees and surcharges still apply (for large items, appliances, etc.). These are ONLY for those assisting evacuees, and the City will not tolerate those attempting to use these services unduly.

CONVENIENT WAYS TO PAY PROPERTY TAXES

The City of Yellowknife would like to advise residents that there are many ways to make your tax payments, including:

- Pre-authorized payment, by signing up for the interest-free tax payment plan;
- Through your bank's telephone and online banking systems;
- In-person at City Hall by cash, cheque, or debit card;
- By mail with a cheque; and
- After hours at the convenient drop box located at City Hall.

Kitchen Fire Procedures

Fire in your Microwave:

Unplug or turn off power; keep door closed to smother the fire.

Fire in your Oven:

Turn off the power; keep door closed to smother the fire.

- Slide a tight-fitting lid on the pot, OR extinguish with baking soda.
