Currie released her first children's album Bouncing in the Boreal, followed by Tickling the Taiga in May 2022.

The City will not host an event on **June 21, 2023**. Instead, residents are encouraged to attend other events happening in the community to celebrate this day!

### FIRE DIVISION OPEN HOUSE

The City of Yellowknife Fire Division is hosting its annual Open House on **Saturday**, **June 24**, **2023 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.** at the Fire Hall located at 100 Taylor Road. Residents are invited to come enjoy a funfilled afternoon, meet local firefighters, learn more about fire safety, and take a tour of the fire hall and trucks.

Planned activities include fire extinguisher training, fire truck rides, balloon animals and face painting. Kids of all ages are invited to take part in a mini-challenge (weather permitting). Complimentary refreshments and hot dogs will be available.

#### CITY'S CONSTRUCTION SEASON IS UNDERWAY

The City of Yellowknife would like to inform residents of the planned construction projects taking place within the city this summer.

- A water service repair and the repaving of a section of 50 Street that includes the replacement of curbs and sidewalks has begun;
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces, curb, and sidewalk on a section of Wiley Road has begun;
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces and curb on a section of Kam Lake Road and Deh Cho Boulevard;
- Work to reinstate all asphalt, curb, and sidewalk that was removed on Hordal Road from Spence Road to Finlayson Drive during last year's upgrades will begin mid-July;
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces, curb, and sidewalk on a section of Franklin Avenue between Weaver Drive and Bretzlaff Drive;
- <u>Phase 1</u> of construction on Franklin Avenue adjacent to the new Aquatic Centre began on June 12. Lane reductions in this area will be in place until the work is complete. In addition there will be no access to Forrest Drive from Franklin Avenue and the sidewalk across from Forrest Drive at Franklin Avenue will be closed. There will be no left hand turns from Franklin Avenue (in construction zone) permitted; and...
- Phase 2 of construction on Franklin Avenue adjacent to the new Aquatic Centre will begin in July. Lane reductions in this area will be in place until the work is complete. In addition there will be no access to Forrest Drive from Franklin Avenue and the sidewalk across from Forrest Drive at Franklin Avenue will be closed. There will be no left hand turns from Franklin Avenue (in construction zone) permitted.

The City thanks residents for their patience as the construction season gets underway and roads or lanes are closed to facilitate the work. Please be attentive to road signs, reduce speeds in construction zones, and plan ahead when commuting, as traffic delays can be expected in construction areas.

#### **Boat Refueling Fire Safety**

The river and smaller lakes are open and the ice is receding from Great Slave Lake. Boating season is upon us! Take fire safety to heart.

When Refueling (Safety Reminders):

- Ensure your 5BC fire extinguisher is operational (serviced annually);
- Turn off all power sources and gas pilot lights;
- Evacuate the boat (no one on board when refueling);
- Lift engine cover to check for leaks/odours; and
- If relevant, run bilge blower before restarting the engine as gas vapours may ignite if not removed.
