

CONSTRUCTION SUMMER 2023

The City of Yellowknife would like to inform residents of the planned construction projects taking place within the city this summer.

- A water service repair and the repaying of a section of 50 Street with the replacement of curbs and sidewalks will begin in late May;
- Work to reinstate all asphalt, curb, and sidewalk that was removed on Hordal Road from Spence Road to Finlayson during last year's upgrades will begin mid-July;
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces, curb, and sidewalk on a section of Franklin between McDonald and Bretzlaff will begin in late June;
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces, curb, and sidewalk on a section of Wiley Road will begin in mid-May; and
- The full replacement of all paved surfaces and curb on a section of Kam Lake Road and Deh Cho Blvd will begin in early June.

The City thanks residents for their patience as the construction season gets underway and roads or lanes are closed to facilitate the work. Please be attentive to road signs, reduce speeds in construction zones, and plan ahead when commuting, as traffic delays can be expected in construction areas.

FROM THE SOLID WASTE FACILITY

The spring Amnesty Day will take place at the Solid Waste Facility on **Saturday May 20, 2023** (one day only). During this event, the Solid Waste Facility will be waiving the residential general tipping fee. All other tipping fees and surcharges still apply. Grass Clippings and Leaves

Leaves, grass clippings, and small brush can be brought to the Solid Waste Facility and disposed of free of charge when placed in a paper bag. However, when this waste comes to the Solid Waste Facility in plastic and other non-compostable bags, it is considered residential garbage and is subject to the associated charges. Let's work together to divert as much waste as possible from the landfill by ensuring that no plastic is mixed with leaf and yard waste. Animal Waste

The City of Yellowknife reminds residents not to place animal waste in their green cart. Animal waste should be taken to the Solid Waste Facility, free of charge, and placed in the yellow Animal Waste bin for safe disposal. The Solid Waste Facility is open to the public from **11:00 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Tuesday to Saturday**.

WHEN SHOULD YOU CALL AN AMBULANCE?

The City of Yellowknife is reminding residents to take into consideration the seriousness of the situation before calling emergency services. The Yellowknife Fire Division (YKFD) continues to receive a high volume of calls for emergency medical services, which is adding pressure on the service.

An ambulance enables firefighter/paramedics to begin medical treatment when they arrive on location, extending treatment through the ambulance during transport to the hospital. An ambulance should only be called for a person who needs immediate emergency medical assistance. The public can help the City improve the availability of all services provided by the YKFD to those who need it most when we reduce the number of calls and call-outs for incidents that do not require an emergency response.

An ambulance should be called for a potentially life-threatening emergency or if the person is experiencing any of the following symptoms:

- Chest pain or chest tightness;
- Sudden numbness or paralysis of the face, arm or leg;
- Large burns;
- Serious accidents or trauma;
- Severe bleeding;
- Difficulty breathing;
- Extreme pain; or
- Unconsciousness.

An ambulance should not be called for the following instances: to treat minor cuts or abrasions, to get quicker attention in the emergency room, or for public situations that are not medical emergencies.

The Yellowknife Street Outreach program assists individuals who are at risk, vulnerable or street-involved and who need help getting to a safe location. If members of the public see someone in need of assistance, and it is not a medical emergency, consider calling (867) 445-7202.

The RCMP should be contacted to report a crime, or for immediate police assistance. When in doubt, always call 9-1-1.

ROAD DUST AND STREET CLEANING

Sidewalk Cleaning

The Highway Traffic By-law states that every owner or occupier of a property with a public sidewalk is required to clear it of any dirt, sand and gravel accumulated during the winter by May 15. Do your part to help keep Yellowknife clean! Sweep your sidewalks and pick up any garbage from the adjacent curb.

Street Cleaning

The City places street sand (crushed quarry gravel) on City roads throughout the winter months to provide residents with safer surface conditions. Snow removal efforts assist in reducing quantities of residual street sand, however, spring melting still reveals substantial amounts of sand and dust that must be swept and cleaned. The City receives numerous requests from residents to remove the dust from City streets as soon as possible, but it does require a considerable amount of time to cover the 164.9 kilometers of paved streets and alleys. We try to schedule street cleaning strategically, both at night and during the day when conditions allow, collecting street sand and dust as quickly as possible.
