FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

From **October 8 to 14, 2023,** the Yellowknife Fire Division is promoting cooking safety as part of this year's edition of Fire Prevention Week. Here are a few useful tips:

- Watch what you heat. Always keep a close eye on what you are cooking;
- Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove and always keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner; and
- Have a "kid- and pet-free zone" of at least 1 meter around the stove or grill and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

FIRE SAFETY AND EDUCATION

Fire Safety Awareness

By following these fire safety tips, you will minimize the risk of fire in your home:

- Use a GFI outlet in the bathrooms;
- Service your furnace or boiler annually;
- Use power bars, not extension cords;
- · Stay in the kitchen when cooking;
- Do not allow candles in bedrooms; and
- Lock lighters/matches away from little hands.

Fire is preventable – be fire-smart.

UTILITY BILL AND TAX PAYMENTS

The City of Yellowknife will be waiving late fees and penalties for utility bill payments until further notice.

In addition to waiving late penalties for residents' utility bills, the City of Yellowknife will also be waiving late penalties for the last property tax installment and final tax levy (for those who did not sign up for a pre-authorized payment plan), due on August 31, 2023. Pre-authorized monthly payments for property taxes will continue.

More Swimming Lessons Available

The City has added two more swimming lessons to the fall schedule. **Rookie Patrol** is a three-level pre-Bronze program for 8-12 year olds who are ready to move beyond the learn-to-swim program.

The Bronze Star swimming class is designed for kids 11 years old and up, and helps to develop swimming proficiency, lifesaving skill and personal fitness.

ATV SAFETY REMINDERS

Here are a few useful tips to help residents stay safe and have fun while ATVing this fall:

- While cruising around on your ATV, don't forget to wear a helmet. All riders must wear an approved helmet at all times, including when on side-by-sides.
- When you head out on your ATV, don't forget to bring your valid driver's license. Don't have your license yet? Be sure to bring along someone who does.
- ATVs are required to have insurance, registration and a license plate attached when operating or parking on the road. Be prepared before you hit the trails!
- Observe traffic laws when on the road to keep yourself and others around you safe.

SCOOP THE POOP

Did you know there are 23 million coliform bacteria per gram of dog poop?

Pet poop that is left in yards, fields, parks and on sidewalks eventually ends up in Yellowknife rivers and lakes. Dog waste is high in nitrogen and phosphorus which promotes algae growth in ponds and streams. It also can contain Giardia, Parvo, Tapeworms, Roundworms, Salmonella and Coccidia which can linger in soil for years. Be a responsible dog owner. Scoop the Poop!
