SPRING REMINDERS

As we welcome spring and the warmer temperatures it brings, the City of Yellowknife reminds residents of important changes happening around the city and precautions that should be taken during the spring melt season.

Roads and Sidewalks

- Exercise extreme caution, particularly in mornings and evenings, as daily temperature changes cause slippery road and sidewalk conditions;
- Before May 15, as per By-law No. 5055, property owners or occupants with a public sidewalk are asked to sweep their sidewalk to clear dirt, sand, and gravel and pick up garbage from the curb to help keep Yellowknife clean;
- The City thanks residents for their patience as crews begin work to repair leaks, perform road maintenance, and complete general spring repairs and street cleaning as quickly as possible; and,
- To report hazards around town, use the City's Click & Fix Application or call (867) 920-5600.

Driving with Caution

- Drivers are asked to slow down, drive with caution, and avoid driving through accumulated water while spring road maintenance is underway.
- Take care not to splash pedestrians when driving by during the spring melt season.

Property Maintenance

- Clear snow from roofs and awnings to avoid injury to pedestrians walking by or into your house or business.
- If proper drainage is not in place during the spring melt, water can accumulate in basements, under trailers, as backyard ponds, or flow onto adjacent properties. To minimize property damage and inconvenience, residents should explore drainage solutions such as pumps and drainage channels to avoid water pooling.

Outdoor Rinks and Thinning Ice

- Outdoor rinks are closed.
- Remember, as temperatures increase, ice will begin to weaken.
 Signs of weak ice include water covering the ice and a change in ice color from clear to milky. Avoid weak ice and areas around protruding rocks or objects.

Scoop the Poop!

 Particularly as snow begins to melt, remember to Scoop the Poop and help keep our community healthy and clean.

FOOD TRUCK LOTTERY

This year's food truck lottery draw takes place on **Wednesday**, **May 15**, **2024**. Food truck operators wishing to participate in the lottery for a designated parking spot in Yellowknife's downtown must have their business license and all related paperwork completed and submitted to the City no later than **Wednesday**, **May 8**, **2024**.

ROAD DUST AND STREET CLEANING

The City places street sand (crushed quarry gravel) on Yellowknife roads throughout the winter months to provide residents with safer surface conditions. Snow removal efforts assist in reducing quantities of residual street sand; however, spring melting still reveals substantial amounts of sand and dust that must be swept and cleaned.

The City receives numerous requests from residents to remove the dust from City streets as soon as possible, but it does require a considerable amount of time to cover the 164.9 kilometers of paved streets and alleys. We try to schedule street cleaning strategically, both at night and during the day when conditions allow, collecting street sand and dust as quickly as possible.

The City of Yellowknife is seeking individuals to fill a vacancy on its Development Appeal Board: an administrative tribunal which hears appeals by persons claiming to be affected by specific decisions made by the Development Officer.

- 1. Test them monthly by pushing the test button;
- 2. Change the batteries annually (mark it on your calendar), including the battery in the hard-wired smoke alarms; and
- 3. Replace them after 10 years.

NEW YELLOWKNIFE TRANSIT FLEET ARRIVES

The City of Yellowknife, together with Transdev, are pleased to announce the launch of the new Yellowknife Transit Fleet, comprising eight state-of-the-art accessible buses. These buses will soon begin to be incorporated into routes as the City transitions to the new fleet. All Yellowknife transit buses, servicing both regular and express routes, will be fully wheelchair accessible, marking a significant milestone in enhancing transportation accessibility for all residents.

Two new buses for the Yellowknife Accessible Transit System (YATS) are anticipated to arrive in Yellowknife later this summer.

With this change, the Find My Bus feature will be out of service until the summer so tracking devices can be upgraded and installed into the new buses.

"The City is excited to see the transition to a new, accessible transit fleet that will be able to service residents of all abilities in our community," Mayor Rebecca Alty said. "These new buses will provide more reliability, expand access to transportation for residents, and modernize our transit infrastructure."

About the buses:

The new conventional transit fleet will feature:

- A fully accessible uniform fleet for all transit routes, including express routes;
- 2 wheelchair capacity per bus;
- ADA compliant "Kneeling buses" with loading ramp;
- 3 spare vehicles to increase service reliability;
- Improved air-ride suspension, which provides more comfort to riders and fewer breakdowns;
- Improved environmental emissions control;
- Improved fare boxes; and
- New branding of the fleet to YKTransit with updated logo.

Some additional features will be installed later this year including Updated real time bus tracking with PassioGo to replace Find My Bus, Automated stop announcements and automated passenger counters.

Yellowknife Accessible Transit Service (YATS) will be getting a new fleet later this year. Those vehicles will feature:

- Robust rear side door lift; all-wheel drive;
- Improved suspension;
- Improved fare boxes; and
- New branding of the fleet to YK Flex, with new logo.
