

ROAD DUST AND STREET CLEANING

Sidewalk Cleaning

The Highway Traffic By-law states that every owner or occupier of a property with a public sidewalk is required to clear it of any dirt, sand and gravel accumulated during the winter by May 15. Do your part to help keep Yellowknife clean! Sweep your sidewalks and pick up any garbage from the adjacent curb.

Street Cleaning

The City places street sand (crushed quarry gravel) on City roads throughout the winter months to provide residents with safer surface conditions. Snow removal efforts assist in reducing quantities of residual street sand, however, spring melting still reveals substantial amounts of sand and dust that must be swept and cleaned.

The City receives numerous requests from residents to remove the dust from City streets as soon as possible, but it does require a considerable amount of time to cover the 164.9 kilometers of paved streets and alleys. We try to schedule street cleaning strategically, both at night and during the day when conditions allow, collecting street sand and dust as quickly as possible.

FROM THE SOLID WASTE FACILITY

Large Item Pick-Up

Do you have large items that you are unable to deliver to the Solid Waste Facility? The City of Yellowknife can arrange for the collection of accepted items, at no extra cost, during the Large Item Pick-Up event, from Monday, May 13 to Friday, May 17, 2024. To request a pick-up, mail, fax, e-mail or drop off a completed form to the City of Yellowknife no later than 12:00 p.m. on Friday, May 10, 2024.

Large items must be placed on the curb for pick-up before 7:00 a.m. on the day of your neighbourhood pick-up. For more information, visit www.yellowknife.ca or call (867) 766-5511.

Grass Clippings and Leaves

Leaves, grass clippings, and small brush can be brought to the Solid Waste Facility and disposed of free of charge when placed in a paper bag. However, when this waste comes to the Solid Waste Facility in plastic and other non-compostable bags, it is considered residential garbage and is subject to the associated charges. Let's work together to divert as much waste as possible from the landfill by ensuring that no plastic is mixed with leaf and vard waste. Animal Waste

The City of Yellowknife reminds residents not to place animal waste in their green cart. Small quantities of animal waste can be placed in the black cart as part of the curbside cart collection program. Large quantities of animal waste are to be taken to the Solid Waste Facility where it is free to drop off, and placed in the yellow Animal Waste bin for safe disposal. The Solid Waste Facility is open to the public from 11:00 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Tuesday to Saturday.

PARKING METER RATE CHANGES

In February 2024, Council passed an amendment to the Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, increasing rates for all parking meters in Yellowknife. Until April 30, the Municipal Enforcement Division will be working across the city to reprogram all parking meters with the new rates. During this transition period, residents may notice some parking meters at the previous rate and some at new rates. The Passport Parking Canada App will be updated with the new rates on May 1, 2024.

Parking meter rates have been increased to \$2.50 per hour at 1 and 2-hour meters. Rates for 9-hour meters have increased to \$1.00 per hour. The rate changes will apply to both the physical meters when paying with coins and digital payments made via the Passport Parking Canada App. For more information on all parking rates, please visit: www.yellowknife.ca/parking.
