

SNOW REMOVAL SCHEDULE

Monday, January 29, 2024

- 57 Street from Franklin Avenue to 51A Avenue;
- Burwash Drive from 56 Street to Forrest Drive; and
- Williams Avenue from Woolgar Avenue to Range Lake Road.

Tuesday, January 30, 2024

- Franklin Avenue from Forrest Drive to Old Airport Road; and
- Dagenais Drive from Range Lake Road to Finlayson Drive North.

Wednesday, January 31, 2024

- 49A Avenue from 43 Street to 42 Street and 42 Street from 49A Avenue to Franklin; and
- Gitzel Street from Franklin Avenue to Matonabee Street.

Thursday, February 1, 2024

- Matonabee Street from Franklin Avenue to McMahon Trail; and
- Moyle Drive from Haener Drive to Haener Drive.

Friday, February 2, 2024

• Rycon Drive from Con Road South to Burwash Drive.

Residents must ensure parked vehicles are removed from these streets by midnight, or they will be towed. Residents are advised that there will be traffic delays in snow removal areas and if possible, to use an alternate route to avoid delays. The City asks residents to ensure Curbside Carts are returned to their property before the scheduled snow removal on their street. Thank you for your patience, and remember to use caution in snow removal areas and not to pass moving equipment.

Trucked Service Access

The City would like to remind properties on trucked water and sewer to keep access to their service connection points clear of snow and ice. If the connection points are not accessible water delivery and/or sewage pumpout may not occur until access problems have been fixed.

ASSESSMENT NOTICES

The City of Yellowknife has mailed Property Assessment Notices to all ratepayers (persons or businesses responsible for paying property taxes). An assessment is a value placed on property (land and buildings) for municipal and school tax purposes.

Please consult <u>A Guide to Property Taxes</u> posted on the City's website for information regarding school support declarations and how to file an appeal of your assessment with the Board of Revision. Appeals may only be filed against the assessment values of your property, not the amount of taxes collected.

The deadline to file a <u>School Support Declaration</u> or <u>Assessment Appeal</u> is **February 19, 2024**.

Property owners can compare their assessment with other similar properties in their neighbourhood using the City's online tool, *CityExplorer*. For land comparisons, ensure similarity of location, lot size and zoning. For building comparisons, ensure similarity of age, quality, style and size.

Board of Revision

The City of Yellowknife is looking for citizens to sit on its Board of Revision, a body established by statute to hear Yellowknife property assessment appeals, and scheduled to sit on **Thursday, April 11, and Friday, April 12, 2024**.

The City welcomes applications from all interested persons, however, those with a background or understanding of the basic process of property assessment and an understanding of how to conduct a hearing effectively to reach appropriate decisions are particularly encouraged to apply. The application deadline is **Friday, February 16, 2024**.

FIRE SAFETY & EDUCATION Chimney Ice Buildup

Look Up! How does your chimney look? Is there a build-up of ice?

Remove the ice build-up on your chimney to ensure it doesn't collapse the chimney liner. With temperatures of -30C and colder, ice builds up quickly. If your chimney liner is damaged, carbon monoxide will invade your home.

Be proactive:

- Remove the ice before it builds up on your chimney;
- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) detector close to your bedrooms; and
- When you have your furnace or boiler serviced, have them check your chimney liner to ensure there is no damage.

SNOWMOBILE SAFTY
