Please do not attend the Fireworks from a public space if:

- You feel sick or have any symptoms of COVID-19:
- You're waiting to hear the results of a lab test for COVID-19;
- You or anyone in your household has been diagnosed with COVID-19:
- You must self-isolate; or
- You are in a household with someone self-isolating who has not maintained physical distance.

Please be aware of the following safety reminders:

- If viewing from Frame Lake, please remember to avoid the safety zone, a 700ft perimeter of the firing area, identified on a map available on the City website;
- Stay clear of the fireworks area and safety zone until 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 1, 2022 to allow crews to complete a safety inspection in the daylight; and
- Please leave pets at home.

WINTER TRAFFIC SAFETY TIPS

The City of Yellowknife wants to remind drivers of a few winter driving safety requirements:

- Always clear excess snow from your vehicle and windshield. Excess snow can obstruct the view of the driver or fly off and land on other cars creating hazards for drivers;
- Ensure your windows are fully defrosted before driving. Driving without adequate view can result in a \$100 penalty;
- During reduced visibility, turn on your headlights! This also turns on your taillights which allows drivers to see you from behind during ice fog and snow; and
- Drive to the conditions. Snow and ice reduce traction, which means you require more stopping distance. Follow at a safe distance and reduce your speed.

Drive safe this holiday season. Plan your ride and arrive alive, don't drink and drive!

- 47th Street from 49th Avenue to 52nd Avenue.

Thursday, January 6, 2022

- 46th Street from 52nd Avenue to Weledeh School; and
