dispose of waste. Signage will be in place and

direction will be given on-site.

Payment: Debit and Credit preferred, although cash will be

What: Recyclables, compost/organics, household

garbage, pet waste, large items and other waste

can be brought to the drop off area.

Capacity: A maximum of 10 people (vehicles) will be

permitted on-site at any given time to ensure physical distancing and to adhere to the public health orders currently in effect in

the NWT.

Parking & Transit

The City of Yellowknife is offering free parking, and not enforcing parking meters, until further notice. All other parking regulations will be enforced.

The City is temporarily waiving transit fees and asks residents to limit public transit use to essential travel only. Express Routes are cancelled until further notice.

SPRING IS HERE

Roads and Sidewalks Maintenance and Clearing

The City is working to complete repairs as quickly as possible and asks for patience while crews perform this work. Report hazards using our online Click & Fix Application at www.yellowknife.ca/clickandfixyk or by calling 920-5600.

- Slippery Conditions: Warmer temperatures by day and colder temperatures at night can cause slippery conditions on roads and sidewalks. Exercise extreme caution, particularly in mornings and evenings.
- Spring Road Repairs: City crews are working hard thawing culverts, pumping puddles, repairing leaks, performing road maintenance, and fixing potholes.
- Public Sidewalks: Help keep Yellowknife clean by sweeping your sidewalks and picking up garbage from the adjacent curb. Property owners or occupiers with a public sidewalk are asked to clear it of any dirt, sand, and gravel accumulated during the winter.

Ice Safety

 The City would like to remind residents to use caution when travelling on the lakes, as the warm weather increases the risk of falling through the ice. If someone has fallen through, contact emergency services by calling 9-1-1, or Fire & Medical: 873-2222.

Driving with Caution

- Drive with Caution: Drivers are asked to slow down, and drive with caution while spring road maintenance is underway.
- Don't Splash Pedestrians: Drivers are reminded to slow down during the spring melt season and take care not to splash pedestrians when driving by.

Property Maintenance

- Clear snow from roofs and awnings: to avoid injury to pedestrians walking by your house or business.
- Water Pooling: If proper drainage is not in place, water can accumulate in basements, under trailers, as backyard ponds or flow onto adjacent properties. To minimize property damage and inconvenience, residents should explore drainage solutions such as pumps and drainage channels.

FIRE SAFETY & EDUCATION

BBQ Fire Safety

Keep these tips in mind for a fire-free BBQ season:

- Clean your BBQ before use and remove grease/fat buildup;
- Replace your propane tank if it's damaged or over 10 years old;
- Use soapy water to test for propane leaks;
- Only use your BBQ outside;
- Place BBQ at least 10' (3m) from house or wood railing;
- Ensure the lid is up when lighting; and
- Turn off tank first to burn off fuel in the lines.

SURFACE WATER LINES

Start Up

As of **June 1, 2020**, water lines will be turned on and residents can connect service lines. Delivery schedules shall remain in place up to and including **June 1** so that residents are not without water during the start-up process.

Shut Down

As of **September 14, 2020** water lines are to be disconnected from each residence. Residents are asked to ensure tanks are full prior to **7:00 a.m.** on **September 14** as delivery schedules will not resume until the first normally scheduled day following this date.

Commissioning of the surface water lines will begin the first week of May with staff members beginning the preliminary inspection of exposed lines and completing noted repairs from damage caused during the winter. During the commissioning process crews will complete necessary repairs and flush and disinfect the lines which have remained stagnant over the winter months. During this time residents will periodically notice water running from various sections of the water system but are asked to refrain from connecting to the water lines prior to the date of June 1. Any use of water in this system for consumption or residential use is strictly prohibited prior to the start date of June 1 as we cannot guarantee water quality until the commissioning process is complete and water quality samples are in place.

Residents will notice staff traversing through private properties in some areas as we progress through the surface line commissioning process and are asked to ensure access is granted where necessary.

SCOOP THE POOP!

Pet poop that is left in yards, fields, parks and on sidewalks eventually ends up in Yellowknife rivers and lakes. Dog waste is high in nitrogen and phosphorus which promotes algae growth in ponds and streams. It also can contain Giardia, Parvo, Tapeworms, Roundworms, Salmonella and Coccidia which can linger in soil for years.

Be a responsible dog owner. Scoop the Poop! Keep our community healthy and clean.
