To ensure that we re-open safely, and are following capacity and other restrictions that are in place, many factors must be considered. Spring Amnesty Event

The Spring Amnesty Event is scheduled to take place from May 19 - 22, from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. During this time the residential \$10.00 tipping fee at the Solid Waste Facility will be waived but other tipping fees will still apply.

At this time, salvaging is not permitted. The City's top priorities remain public and staff safety, and continued essential service delivery. Salvaging will resume at a time when it is safe to do so. Residents should expect delays as there will be a limited number of vehicles permitted on site at one time.

Outdoor Fire Safety

With the snow melt, warmer temperatures, and brisk winds outdoor combustibles are drying up. To prevent grass and brush fires, please dispose of your cigarette butts properly.

Burning Permits

The Yellowknife Fire Division has begun fire pit inspections for the season. If you are planning to burn grass, brush, or having a campfire, you must obtain a permit.

Unless you have an approved fire pit, you are prohibited from burning. Burning without a permit will result in a fine.

Working from Home

The Yellowknife Fire Division would like to remind residents of the following safe practices while working from home:

- Stay in the kitchen when cooking;
- Charge electronic devices on a firm surface;
- · Don't overload electrical outlets; and
- Plan and practice your exit drills.
