Solid Waste Facility

The Solid Waste Facility is open to the public beginning with reduced hours:

Hours:	Wonday – Friday, 1:00 – 4:00 p.m.
Location:	Residents may use the designated drop off area to dispose of waste.

- Payment: Debit and Credit preferred, although cash will be accepted.
- What: Recyclables, compost/organics, household garbage, pet waste, large items and other waste can be brought to the drop off area.
- Capacity: A maximum of 10 people (vehicles) will be permitted on-site at any given time to ensure physical distancing and to adhere to the public health orders currently in effect in the NWT.

FOOD TRUCK LOTTERY

Road Dust & Street Cleaning

Snow removal efforts assist in reducing quantities of residual street sand; however, spring melting still reveals substantial amounts of sand and dust that must be swept and cleaned.

The City receives a high number of requests to remove sand, and we try to schedule street cleaning strategically, both at night and during the day when conditions allow and as guickly as possible. Residents can assist in the delivery speed of this operation by not sweeping their driveway debris into the street after the cleaning operation has passed and moving parked vehicles to a different location once the street sweeper has passed in order for the remaining gravel to be collected when the street sweeper returns.

Sidewalk Cleaning

Help keep Yellowknife clean by sweeping your sidewalks and picking up garbage from the adjacent curb. Property owners or occupiers with a public sidewalk are asked to clear it of any dirt, sand, and gravel accumulated during the winter.

Property Maintenance

If proper drainage is not in place, water can accumulate in basements, under trailers, as backyard ponds or flow onto adjacent properties. To minimize property damage and inconvenience, residents should explore drainage solutions such as pumps and drainage channels.

SURFACE WATER LINES

As of **June 1, 2020**, water lines will be turned on and residents can connect service lines. Delivery schedules shall remain in place up to and including **June 1** so that residents are not without water during the start-up process.

As of **September 14, 2020** water lines are to be disconnected from each residence. Residents are asked to ensure tanks are full prior to **7:00 a.m.** on **September 14** as delivery schedules will not resume until the first normally scheduled day following this date.

During the commissioning process, crews will complete necessary repairs and flush and disinfect the lines which have remained stagnant over the winter months. During this time residents will periodically notice water running from various sections of the water system but are asked to refrain from connecting to the water lines prior to the date of June 1.

Any use of water in this system for consumption or residential use is strictly prohibited prior to the start date of June 1 as we cannot guarantee water quality until the commissioning process is complete and water quality samples are in place.

Residents will notice staff traversing through private properties in some areas as we progress through the surface line commissioning process and are asked to ensure access is granted where necessary.
