# **PUBLIC NOTICE REFERENDUM 2021**

On **November 23, 2021** the City will ask Yellowknife voters for permission to borrow up to \$10,001,000, for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost to develop an Aquatic Centre.

#### You are eligible to vote if you:

- Are a Canadian citizen;
- Have attained 18 years of age; and
- Have resided within the municipal boundary of Yellowknife for 12 consecutive months immediately before the day they cast their vote.

#### How to Vote:

The Aquatic Centre Referendum will be conducted by Mail-in Ballot. Ballot kits will be mailed to all eligible voters on the Voters List. The ballot kit will include instructions on how to complete the ballot, declaration form, secrecy envelope and a postage-paid envelope. Voters may return their ballot kit by return mail, Drop Box at Yellowknife City Hall, or by bringing it to a Voter Assistance location on **November 23, 2021**. All ballots must be received by the City by **7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 23, 2021**. Ballots received after that time will not be counted.

\*Eligible voters who do not receive a ballot or require voting assistance, may attend a Voter Assistance location and be sworn in to vote or receive assistance with their ballot.

#### Voter Assistance Locations:

Voter Assistance Locations will be open from 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. at the following locations:

- Multiplex
- Tree of Peace

A voter requiring assistance with their ballot kit, or who has not received a ballot kit, may attend one of the Voter Assistance Locations to vote.

#### **Proxy Voting:**

Anyone unable to vote by Mail-in Ballot or at a Voter Assistance Location on **November 23, 2021**, may request a proxy voter application from the Returning Officer at City Hall. The deadline to apply is 3:00 p.m. on **Thursday, November 18, 2021**. A Proxy Voter must be eligible to vote at the referendum (see Voter Eligibility) and must vote for you in person at a Voter Assistance Location.

### YELLOWKNIFE COMMUNITY ARENA TO REOPEN AS A TEMPORARY DAY SHELTER

The City of Yellowknife would like to once again acknowledge and thank Yellowknifers and the user groups of the Yellowknife Community Arena as the use of the facility as a temporary day shelter is extended.

On **Friday, October 15, 2021**, Shane Thompson, Minister of Municipal and Community Affairs, declared a state of local emergency in Yellowknife from **October 19, 2021**, and outlined the plan to establish the former Yellowknife's Northern Frontier Visitors Center site a temporary day shelter. This site is scheduled to open by the end of November 2021. In the interim, the City worked collaboratively with the GNWT to ensure the Yellowknife Community Arena could be reopened as a day shelter beginning on **October 25, 2021**. The City thanks Yellowknife Community Arena user groups for their understanding while this facility is unavailable for recreational use, as we work together as a community to support our vulnerable populations.

### **FIRE SAFETY & EDUCATION Exit Drills in the Home**

Now is a great time to practice your home escape plan. Like any activity, practice reveals areas that require attention. Steps:

- Discuss your plan with everyone in your home; then:
- Sound the smoke alarm.
- Evacuate your home through your primary escape route. (Front door?) Close the door behind you. "Get Out & Stay Out!" Practice getting out in under a minute.
- Everyone should meet at your meeting place outside. (Is anyone missing?)
- Report the fire (9-1-1 or 873-2222) from outside your home.

Once this is familiar, block the main exit and have family exit through second way out. Practice the drill when the kids are in bed. (Studies have shown that 9/10 children stay in bed when the smoke alarm activates.) Fire doesn't always happen to someone else. Learn more at www. yellowknife.ca/fireprevention.
