A BY-LAW of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories, to officially open and name a municipal roadway within the City of Yellowknife.

PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 86 and 88 of the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act*, S.N.W.T. 2003, c. 22.

WHEREAS it is desirable to open and name a street within the Municipal boundaries of the City of Yellowknife in honour of a citizen who made a significant contribution to the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF YELLOWKNIFE, in regular session duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

APPLICATION

1. That the roadway located at Lot 39, Block 308 and Lot 10, Block 307, Plan 3953 as outlined on Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law, be officially opened and named **LEMAY DRIVE** after Adolph Lemay and his son Aurel Lemay, early day residents of Yellowknife. Adolph Lemay arrived in Yellowknife in 1936 and worked as a carpenter at the Negus Mine building houses for the personnel, the bunkhouse and the pipeboxes for the steam pipes. Aurel Lemay arrived in Yellowknife in 1940 and also worked at Negus Mine. Adolph left Yellowknife in 1952 to seek medical treatment and passed away in 1953. Aurel Lemay remained in Yellowknife and worked as a hoistman at the Negus and Con Mines for over 40 years until his retirement in 1982. Aurel Lemay retired in Yellowknife.

EFFECT

This By-law shall come into effect upon receiving Third Reading and otherwise meets the requirements of Section 75 of the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act*.
